

**Incident / Investigation - Case #: 2015-012291 : Off. Narr**

On April 28, 2015, I responded to 1919 Wells Rd (Home Depot), in reference to a shoplifting call for service. Upon my arrival, I made contact with the witness, Aaron Zygadlo, who advised that a white male (suspect), had snatched a chainsaw (valued at \$394.68) out of his hand, while he was attempting to scan it at the cash register, and fled the business without paying for the item.

A. Zygadlo advised that when he saw the suspect approach the exit, he noticed the man was trying to avoid looking him in the face as he attempted to pass all points of purchase without paying for the item. Due to the suspect's suspicious behavior, A. Zygadlo stood in front of the exit and advised he would help "ring him up" for the chainsaw. A. Zygadlo said he took the chainsaw out of the suspect's hand and placed it on the cash register counter, keeping his hand on it. A. Zygadlo said the suspect suddenly snatched the chainsaw out of his hand and sprinted out of the store. A. Zygadlo said the suspect entered a blue Kia Sorrento with tan trim and drove away from the parking lot of 1919 Wells Road.

A. Zygadlo advised the white male was wearing a t-shirt (unknown color), red plaid shorts, approximately 160 lbs, 5'7, with dark brown cropped hair, and brown eyes.

A. Zygadlo created a receipt for the stolen merchandise, and completed a sworn written statement.

I made contact with Tammie Fowler (store manager) who advised she could not access the video recording cache in the Loss Prevention Office. T. Fowler advised she would make contact with the loss prevention officers and contact the Clay County Sheriff's office once she had access to the footage of the incident.

The receipt was submitted into evidence.

This case is transferred to the Robbery Homicide Unit.

Total Investigative Time \$20.50 X 1.5 hours = \$30.75.
