

JUVENILE INFORMATION

If you are requesting any juvenile information where the juvenile is the victim of a crime or an offender of a misdemeanor crime, you must have proof of being the parent or proof of being a legal guardian.

You will have to provide your state driver's license or photo id card and one of the following:

- The child's U.S. birth certificate, including some U.S. territories and District of Columbia (birth certificates from Puerto Rico must have an issue date after July 1, 2010);
- The child's Valid U.S. passport or passport card;
- The child's Consular Report of Birth Abroad;
- The child's Certificate of Naturalization, form N-550 or form N-570; or
- The child's Certificate of Citizenship, form N-560 or form N-561.

*Only a birth certificate issued by a [county health department](#) or the [CDC Bureau of Vital Statistics](#) will be accepted. **Hospital birth certificates are not considered a certified document and will not be accepted.**

Florida State Statute 985.04, certain juvenile information is confidential and exempt from Florida State Statute 119.07(1).
